### BACK WITH A BANG

"Your connecting of donors and doers has nurtured countless dreams across the continent and transformed them into tangible realities," said Her Excellency Jeannette Kagame, the keynote speaker at the July **Annual Meeting in Kigali**. Over 600 members of our community gathered for networking, learning, and celebrating at #Segal2023.

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### CATALYZING CHANGE

When it comes to equitable giving, part of our work is collaborating with progressive donors to fund African visionaries with big ideas. In Kigali, we hosted **our first Donor Salon** as a platform for honest conversations with 85 fellow funders from four continents around money, power dynamics, and the how behind the why.

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### STRONGER TOGETHER

Following catastrophic flooding from Cyclone Freddy in Malawi, local partners formed the **Tili Limodzi Coalition**. We worked with Hilton Foundation, Myriad USA, and Vitol Foundation to funnel emergency funding to partners on the ground already working in rapid needs assessment, food security, healthcare access, and restoring clean water services.

Barry Segal created Segal Family Foundation to "fight for the little guys." He gave us the compass that guides us to this day: going where others won't, funding those who aren't yet globally recognized, and attempting what others will not. He also selected some of our most cherished, high-performing partners who continue to serve as exemplars for the rest of our community today through our Luminary Circle.

# BUILDING AN ORGANIZATION 2011–2015



We hired full-time staff, including our first Africa-side hires, and built systems to house our grantmaking. All this was done with the goal of minimizing formality and maximizing flexibility—a principle of nimbleness we continue to hold dear. With our first Annual Meetings and country-level convenings, we gave teeth to Barry's idea that there is value in building a community of our partners.


# BUILDING A POINT OF VIEW 2016-2019


#### **EXPERIMENTATION & GROWTH**

by many of our peers.
